Copper College 2010

The American Copper Council's 17th biennial Copper College will continue the tradition established thirty years ago when a group of 75 copper industry executives organized a meeting to expand their knowledge of the industry and to get a better understanding of the significant changes that were occurring in the markets. The business has changed tremendously since 1976, but the desire for education among industry leaders continues to draw them to Copper College.

This year's multi-faceted program will include seminars, lectures, workshops and roundtable discussions; Copper 101, the ACC's introductory level overview of the copper industry; a tour of Freeport-McMoRan's mining complex in Miami, Arizona; and a variety of social activities. There will be three receptions, two dinners, golf and tennis tournaments and many networking opportunities. Registrants are encouraged to bring spouses and guests, for whom a special program is offered.

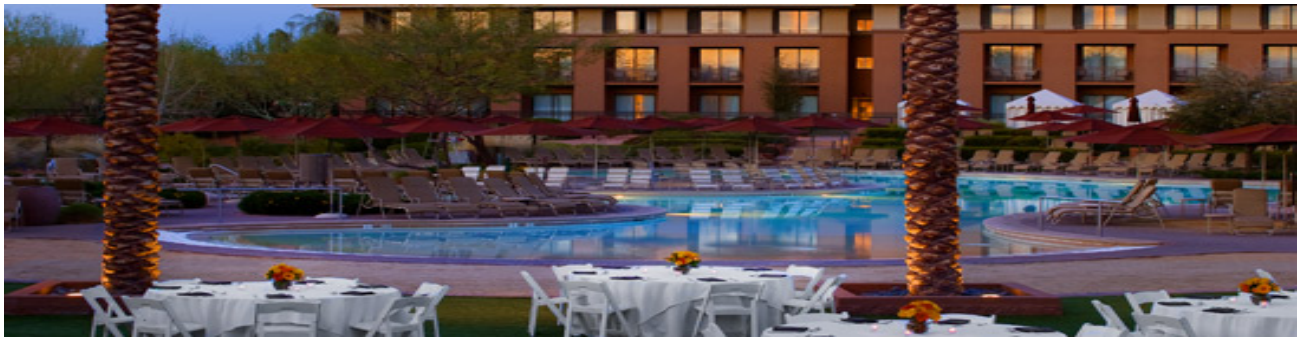
For newcomers to the industry, the Education Program will include *Copper 101: An Introduction to Copper*. This is the ACC's highly regarded survey course, which defines the roles of the Producer, Scrap Dealer, Merchant, Metal Exchanges, and Brass and Wire Mills. It also includes a Basic Hedging course. Many now-experienced members of the industry credit this course with providing them with tools they continue to use today.

At the end of the 101 session, students will meet with their colleagues from the General Session for the *Copper Trading Workshop*. In this team-building event, students will solve hedging problems as presented by a Producer, a Consumer, a Merchant and a Scrap Dealer.

Mine Tour

Freeport-McMoRan will host a tour of their mining facility in Miami, Arizona, where copper has been produced for well over 100 years. The tour of Freeport-McMoRan's operations will include the open-pit mine and SX/EW facilities as well as the smelter and copper rod manufacturing plants.
